# Requirements for the OPWDD Medicaid Waiver Funded Program

- Eligible for Medicaid Waiver Services
- Social Security Income (SSI)
- Completed High School (any diploma)
- Third Grade or higher reading and writing ability
- Commitment to living independently
- Motivation to be a part of the community
- Desire to continue your education
- Ability to follow program and school rules
- Emotional and behavioral stability

# Graduate Outcomes

From 2007 to 2011:

- 87% (20 of 23) successfully live alone or with a housemate/spouse and receiving minimal or no staff supports
- 61% (14 of 23) currently have paid employment or volunteer their time
