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













- Development of a *four-year* program of study for Students with ID, age 18-21, with intellectual disabilities

No matter where students go they have access to the internet and useful applications (apps) to:

- Communicate via e-mail, facetime, or skype.
- Schedule courses and appointments
- To complete employment applications or communicate with possible employers
- To research employment opportunities





According to the Second National Longitudinal Study (NLTS2), persons with intellectual disabilities showed dramatic drops in post-school employment between 1990 and 2005 (Newman, Wagner, Cameto, Knokey, & Shaver, 2010)

This trend is unlikely to change because current approaches with this population continue to focus on training and job placement in low-growth occupations (National Council on Disability, 2007).

Community and Career Studies (CCS) seek to focus on new employment opportunities afforded by the burgeoning of internet communities (such as LinkedIn), (National Council on Disability 2011).


