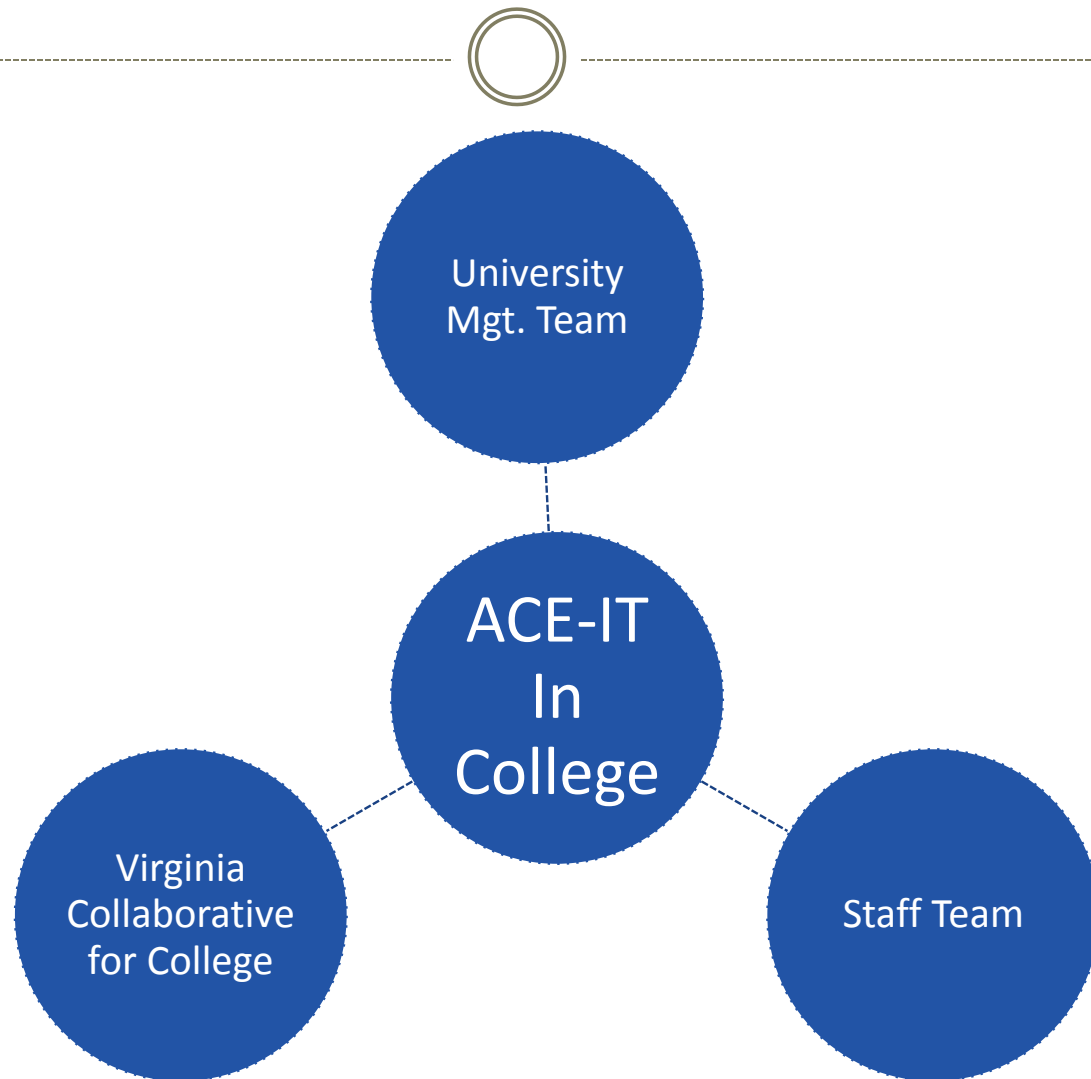

Role of Advisory Committee

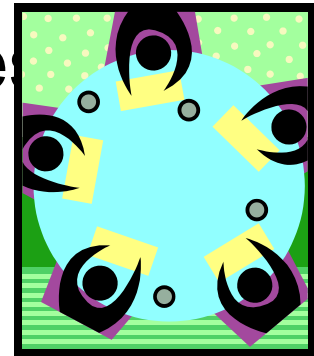


- Determine how strategic plan can be disseminated and discussed through your agency or organization networks

Strategic Plan



- Build state and local infrastructure for inclusive postsecondary education
- Develop policies and procedures for funding and access to inclusive postsecondary education
- Over 5 years up to 20 students will participate at VCU and 2 community colleges

Components of ACE-IT in College



- 5-year demonstration grant through US Department of Education
- Postsecondary education opportunities for students with intellectual disabilities
- “Program of one” established at VCU
- Replication at two community colleges beginning in Year 3 of the project

Components of ACE-IT in College



- Two students started classes at VCU in August 2011
- Program of one model will be a concurrent enrollment—students still eligible for FAPE
- Three school divisions: Chesterfield, Powhatan and City of Richmond
- Currently reviewing applications for individuals no longer in secondary schools between the ages of 18-26 to begin at VCU Spring Semester 2012

ACE-IT in College



- Students complete an application and participate in an interview conducted by project staff members.
- Selected participants apply to VCU for admission. Their designation is Special Student which is an existing category at VCU.
- Selected participants have a person-centered plan prior to entering college

ACE-IT in College



- Students select courses through VCU catalog, advising done through School of Education (audit or credit)
- Students will have education coaches to assist directly in class and/or outside of class for tutoring, etc
- Will earn existing certificate through School of Education.



School of Education Certificate



21 credits

School of Education Certificate

- 4 required courses (10 - 11 credits)
(i.e., intro to university,
science/environment/natural,
literature/writing/art/music, and social
studies/civilization/global community)
- Up to 4 electives (9 - 11 credits)

ACE-IT in College



- Part-time employment is part of the program. Currently both students have on campus employment in their areas of interest.
- Students have opportunities to engage in campus social activities of their choice



Erik's Snapshot: August 2011



- **VCU Student:** 20 years old, has autism spectrum disorder, received a Special Diploma.
- **Interests:** Loves sports and fitness
- **Courses:** Freshmen orientation and wants a sports and fitness class
- **Education Coach Focus:** Orient to campus, participate in class activities, answer questions.
- **Work experience:** Part-time at VCU gym
- **Career goal:** Exploring opportunities through VCU



Erik's Snapshot: November, 2011



Erik

- Is initiating conversations with his education coach and peers.
- Received a 96 on a project in one of his classes, using the assistance of his educational coach. He uses no other accommodations.
- Is considering taking a class for credit next semester.
- Has learned to navigate the campus independently.
- Loves the VCU Rams basketball team.



Katie's Snapshot: August 2011



- **VCU Student:** 21 years old, has an intellectual disability, received a special education diploma.
- **Interests:** Working with children
- **Courses:** Auditing freshmen orientation and an introduction to education class
- **Education Coach Focus:** Using assistive technology independently.
- **Work experience:** Part-time at University Child Development Center
- **Career goal:** To own her own daycare center.



Katie's Snapshot: November, 2011



Katie

- is working with her education coach learning her assistive technology.
- is interested in living on campus at some point.
- Will take 2 courses for credit next semester
- enjoys working with the toddlers (age 2) at the University Child Development Center.
- recently drove to and from VCU independently.
