

  - Less likely to see members of their family and friends
  - Having less privacy at home

# Needs for Three Immediate Resources (based on the interviews)



- Access to career centers
- Access to highly trained teachers
- Access to job coaches and mentors who would frequently follow-up on the progress of the student trainees
